E-RESOURCES

In addition to the literature collected in printed form, the MUG Main Library provides access to the collection in electronic form. The Primo search engine is used to search databases, electronic journals and e-books.

E-books search

To check whether our library has access to a digital version of a particular book, simply search in the "MUG Library" catalog. If you select the "Availability" filter -> available online, you will get a list limited to e-resource records.



E-journals search

There are two ways to check whether our library has access to a particular journal in electronic form. The first is analogous to searching for e-books, **i.e. we enter the journal title we need in the search box.**

Then, it is worth remembering to narrow the search results using the relevant filters (e.g. **"Peer-reviewed Journals" in the "Availability" filter and/or "Journals" in the "Resource Type" filter**).





After clicking on this, a new search bar will appear where you enter the title of the journal you are looking for or its ISSN.



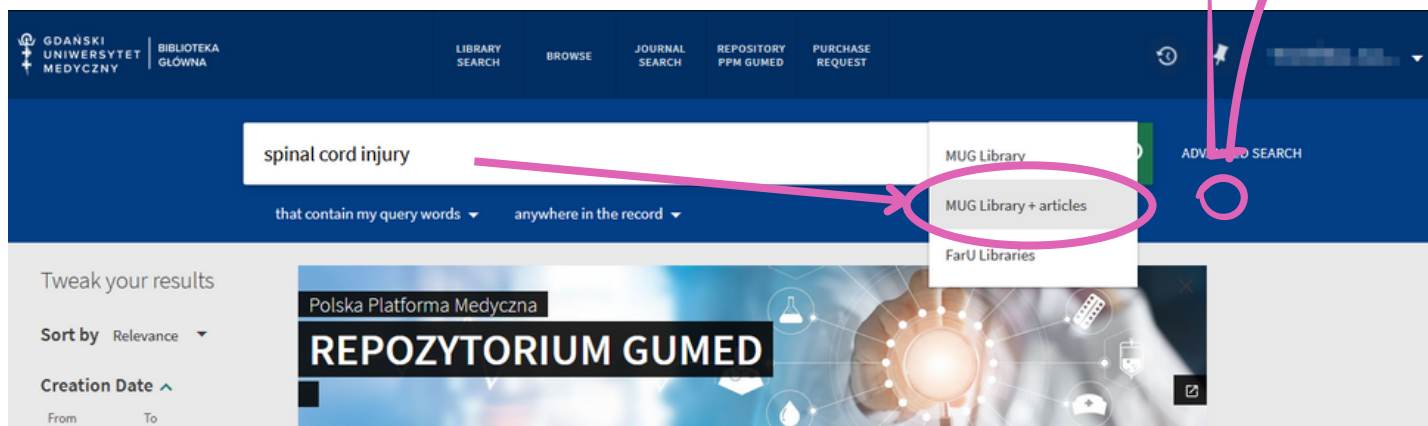

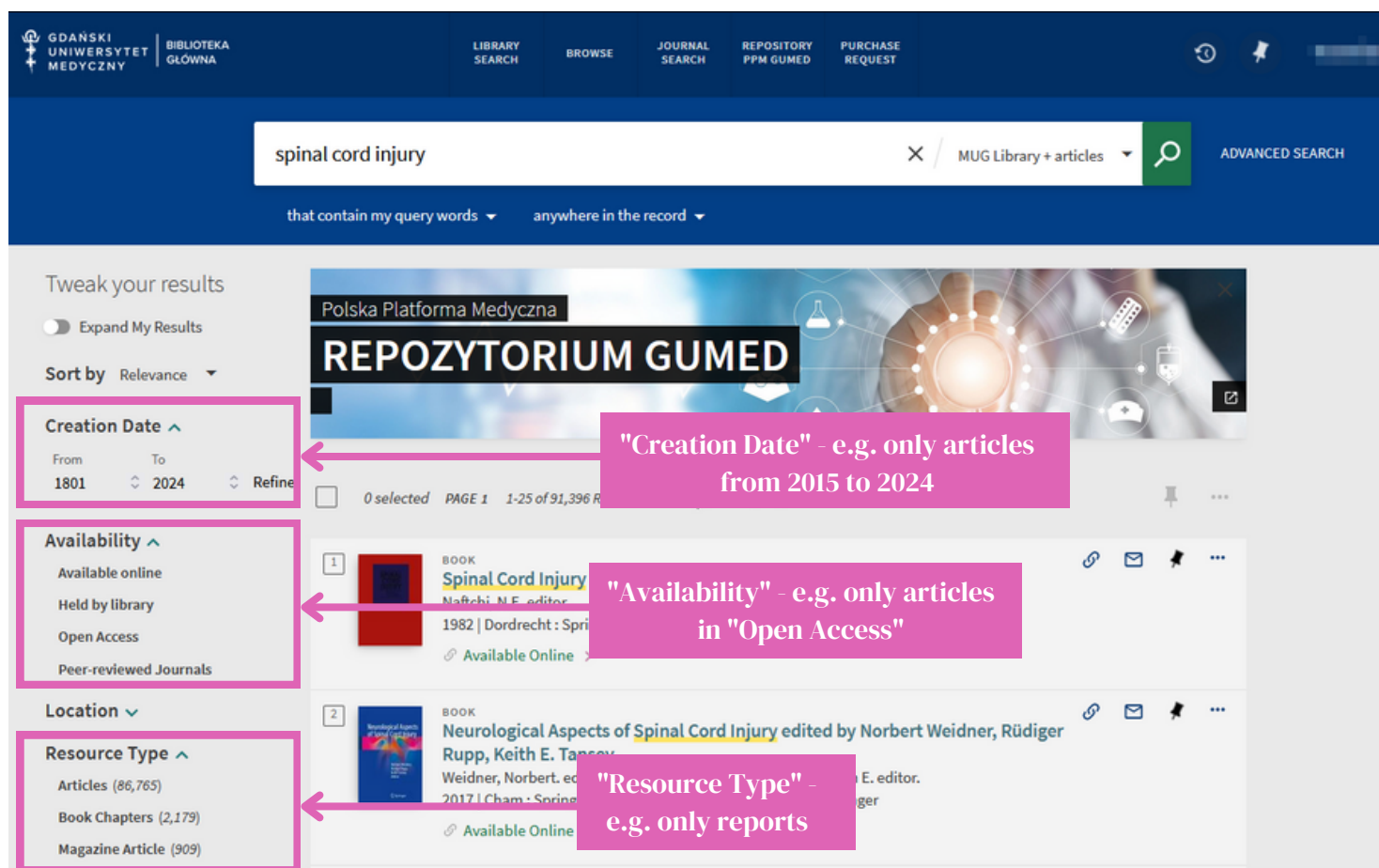

Online articles search

If you would like to find specific articles in electronic version, please remember to select the "MUG Library + articles".



Since the "MUG Library + articles" catalog shows not only articles, but also books or journals, it is worthwhile, if you receive too many search results, to tweak the results using the appropriate filters.



Also in this case, electronic publication records in the results list will have a green "Available Online" label.

How to access e-books, e-journals or online articles?

To access a particular journal, book or article in electronic form, click on the item of interest in the list of search results. A preview of **the full bibliographic record** will open; in the **"View Online"** section you will see a link with the name of the collection(s) and, in the case of journal titles, the time range of the available journal articles.
